Background:

- Held yearly since 1992 by the International Institute of Space Law (IISL)
- Involves about 80-100 law schools from around the world every year
- Prior space law course NOT a prerequisite. Many schools that have no space law course have won Regional Rounds and World Finals
- Largest round in the five Regional Rounds: Africa, Asia Pacific, North America, Latin America, Europe

Asia Pacific Regional Rounds:

- Registration deadline: 20 December 2023
- Memorials deadline: 28 February 2024
- Oral round qualification: Late April 2024
- Regional oral rounds: 8-9 June 2024 (TBD by December 2023)
 Gakushuin Univ., Tokyo, Japan
- Registration fee: ¥40,000 (per team)
- Accommodation fee: approximately ¥30,000 40,000 (for 4 nights)
- Financial support will be usually provided for the winning team to join the World Finals.

World Finals:

- Traditionally judged by the International Court of Justice (ICJ) judges.
- Held in October along with the International Astronautical Congress, which provides opportunities to meet space lawyers and space industry representatives from around the world.
- The 2024 World Finals will take place in Milan, Italy.
